


Showing Up Differently in Community




Featured Partnership: Pathways to Success

Twin Cities Habitat has embarked on a new partnership with Minneapolis Public Housing Authority and workforce development nonprofit Twin Cities R!SE, dubbed *Pathways to Success*.

This collaboration provides a holistic approach to supporting clients on their path to homeownership. The transformative program supports people as they transition from public housing to meaningful employment and, ultimately, Habitat homeownership.









New Building Strategies: Harrison Townhomes

In Minneapolis, Twin Cities Habitat is partnering with private developers and every level of government to build 17 townhomes in the Harrison neighborhood. This project creates affordable homebuying opportunities for residents at risk of displacement in this rapidly-growing community.

To get this done, we've employed a new approach to building these homes, using a blend of subcontractors and volunteers. The pros handle framing through drywalling, and our generous volunteers come in for painting and finishing. This efficient and collaborative approach may serve as a model for major developments in the future.

All three buildings are framed and volunteers are now hard at work turning houses into homes for local families. Construction will be completed by summer 2024.

What's Ahead: The Heights

Our next major development is at The Heights on St. Paul's East Side. Twin Cities Habitat will build 130–150 homes as part of a larger redevelopment effort that includes 1,000 housing units and light industrial. Stay tuned for funding and volunteer opportunities!



Youare a Dream-Maker

That's what Carroll's dad would say whenever someone asked him why he was moving his family from Togo to the United States. *To find a place for my kids*. Carroll was seven when they moved into their Minneapolis apartment in 2004. Less than a year later, Carroll's dad passed away.

"It left all of us devastated," Carroll shares. Carroll had been close to her dad, and the loss took a big toll on her. She struggled with anxiety and depression through her youth and into adulthood. Throwing herself into her schoolwork was the only way Carroll made it through. She later went to college to study Psychology. That's when she had her daughter, Alexandria.

"After having my daughter my mental health was at an all-time low," Carroll remembers. "I often felt defeated. But I knew only I was responsible for my own happiness and for my future. That is the moment I decided to live life and invest in my daughter's and my future by becoming a homeowner."

Carroll poured everything into her homeownership journey. She saved as much as she could and spent a lot of time researching about homeownership, all while finishing her degree, working part-time, and being a new mom.

Carroll knew about Habitat for Humanity through her friend Adade, who is a Real Estate Agent and had previously worked as a Homeownership Advisor with Habitat. With Adade as her Realtor, Carroll fell in love with a Habitat-developed home in Apple Valley. In June 2023, she closed on her home and moved in.

Right away, Carroll and her boyfriend Bahati worked hard to turn their house into a home. One of the first things they did was decorate Alexandria's room in pink, her favorite color, with LED lights lining the walls for family dance parties.

The future looks brighter every day for Carroll's family. She recently started a master's program, Bahati is working a new job, and Alexandria just started kindergarten.

Shortly after buying her home, Carroll traveled back to Togo and brought Alexandria with for the first time. Alexandria loved playing with all her cousins, and Carroll loved returning to the home she knew at her daughter's age—her Grandma's home.

"I remember all the memories I used to have there," Carroll smiles. "I remember playing. I remember riding my bike here and falling over there. Making the choice to become a homeowner, I knew that I wanted that for my daughter as well—to come back and say *this is where I grew up.*"

Now, Carroll's done exactly what her dad set out to do. She's found a place for herself, and for her child.
