Lindsay is in her mid-30s. She has a job she loves as a Program Manager at a Montessori School in St. Paul's East Side. She has a 16-year-old Chihuahua named Lily. But she didn't own a home. Like so many of her generation, the dream of homeownership seemed too far out of reach. Decades ago, starter homes would've been affordable to someone with her income. Skyrocketing housing costs and stagnating wages put a dent in that dream.

Still, Lindsay was determined to try.

Lindsay partnered with NeighborWorks Home Partners to build a budget and start saving for a home. She even found a Real Estate Agent and started house hunting, but everything—even a studio apartment—was stretching her budget. The Habitat for Humanity®


