

Growing up in Chicago, Bridgette was close with her grandmother and often visited her small duplex. "She always made that itty bitty space special," Bridgette remembers. "It was my safe space."

When Bridgette's own grandson was born in 2020, she wanted to provide that space for him. But her apartment rent kept rising, so she began outlining financial goals to become a homeowner. In early 2024, she reached her goals and joined Twin Cities Habitat's new Advancing Black Homeownership Program.

From the moment she met staff, she felt warmly welcomed and supported—just like family. While buying a house can be stressful, Habitat staff offered a calm environment, provided personalized support, and made learning fun.

"Everything was stress-free and streamlined," Bridgette describes. "Work had to be done, but staff made the process understandable. I don't know of anyone else who's doing what Habitat is doing."

June 25—Bridgette's closing date—was about more than moving to her new townhome in Blaine. It was about legacy, family, and a dream come true.

"All I could say was 'Thank you, God.' My grandmother and mother are gone," Bridgette shares, "but I still feel them. Their homes were warm. They made me the person I am. And now I can give that to my grandson."

For Bridgette, seeing her grandson walk into her house for the first time was even better than getting her keys...

# **Jack Gives Back**

There are many great reasons to volunteer with Habitat. You can learn new skills. Make friends. Stay active. For Jack, who has volunteered for 39 years, it's all of the above—but it also goes deeper.

"Housing affects so many aspects of life, from health to education and equity," says Jack. "My father was a beneficiary of the GI Bill, which means my family had access to resources others didn't. When I heard about Habitat's work, it seemed like an obvious way to be part of the solution. We're obligated to those around us."

Jack has found many ways to give back with Habitat. He helped launch Holy Hammers, a group of volunteers from local churches, to build a Habitat home each summer. He started a Habitat servicelearning project for high school students he worked with. When Jack retired, he joined a year-round Regular Crew that volunteers on build sites and at Habitat's warehouse.

"Volunteering is always rewarding, even if you don't see the immediate impact," he says. "As long as I can, I'll be out on the build site."
